HOW TO PREPARE AND PRESENT YOUR CASE - California

WebWhen your name is called, you and the other party in your case will move to the front of the room and tell your stories to the judge. Small claims cases usually take no more than 10 or 15 minutes. It is very important that you plan ahead of time what you will say. Your story should be well organized and to the point.
